Something to think about

The Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations

Robert Schnase, a Bishop of the United Methodist Church in the USA, wrote a series of books about the five practices of fruitful congregations, and the five practices of fruitful living. What follows is an outline of the five practices.

Chapter 1 receiving God's love: The practice of Radical hospitality

1 John 4:14 We love because God first loved us.

Focus points:

1. Radical hospitality involves being receptive to God's love and intentionally making room for God in our lives.
2. Grace is the initiating, gift-like quality of God's love that seeks us and changes us. Jesus is the ultimate expression of God's grace.
3. The good life comes from patterns of opening ourselves to God's grace rather than closing ourselves off from God – from saying Yes to the spiritual life rather than No – and often we come to a place of receptivity through unexpected moments or events.

Chapter 2 Loving God in return: The practice of passionate worship

***Psalmist 84:1-2 How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts!
My soul longs, indeed it faints for the courts of the Lord.***

Focus points:

1. Worship expresses our love for God and connects us to God.
2. Worship changes us; it is a means of grace.
3. There is great mystery in worship.
4. Passionate worship is dynamic, vibrant expression of a fruitful relationship with God.

Chapter 3 Growing in Grace: The practice of intentional faith development

***Acts 2:42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship,
to the breaking of bread and the prayers.***

Focus points:

1. Intentional Faith Development is purposefully learning in community outside of worship in order to deepen our faith and to grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of God.
2. We learn faith in community because Jesus and the New Testament have taught us to learn this way, and because spirituality cannot be learned alone.
3. When we practice Intentional Faith Development, we
 - Are changed from the inside out as we come to know God more intimately and follow Christ more closely;
 - Become attentive to the presence and working of the Spirit;
 - Become part of a supportive community;

- Find strength to change direction and make good decisions;
- Give and receive encouragement;
- And practice caring for one another.

Chapter 4 Loving Others: The practice of risk-taking mission and service

1 Peter 3:15 Always be ready to make a defence to anyone who demands from you an account of your hope; but with gentleness and reverence.

Matthew 25:40 Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.

Focus points:

1. There are various common motivations for serving others, and the Holy Spirit purifies them all when we serve with the right spirit and focus, serving the purposes of Christ.
2. In Christ, we discover that we are all interconnected; we belong to one another because we belong to God.
3. We discover ourselves and become the persons God created us to be when we give ourselves to others in Christ-like service.
4. Risk-taking Mission and Service changes lives and transforms the world.
5. The practice of Risk-taking Mission and Service pushes us out of our comfort zone and into places we would never go on our own, which involves learning to overcome fear.

Chapter 5 The Grace of Giving: The practice of extravagant generosity

2 Corinthians 9:11 You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity.

Focus points:

1. The root of generosity is God's love. Knowing God and experiencing God's love lead to generosity.
2. Generosity helps us to flourish by
 - Aligning us with God's purposes
 - Changing us inside
 - Mirroring God's nature
 - Fostering a healthy relationship to money
 - Encouraging intentionality
 - Deepening our relationship with God
 - Honouring Christ's sacrifice
3. The realisation that all that we are comes from God and belongs to God leads us to the practice of extravagant Generosity. Those who operate from this perspective – that of a steward – find greater happiness.
4. Generosity results from a reorientation in our thinking about how we find contentment in life. Contentment is determined by inner spiritual qualities, not by outward circumstances, visible achievements, or material comforts.
5. Tithing is a way of putting God first; it is an outward sign of an inner spiritual alignment.

Chapter 6 Excellence and Fruitfulness: Fruitful Living and Offering God's Love

John 15:8 "My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.

Focus points:

1. The disciples of Jesus Christ bear fruit.
2. Living fruitfully involves communicating the love of God.
3. The church fulfills its mission at the margins of the congregation where those who actively follow Christ encounter those who are not part of the community of faith.
4. Radical hospitality toward God becomes Radical Hospitality towards others.

Perhaps these five practices are something we could discuss over lunch after church sometime soon. Let me know if you are interested.
