#### Reflection

On 28 June 2022, the Australian Bureau of Statics (ABS) released the first round of results of the 2021 Australian Census of Population and Housing. The Census was undertaken in August 2021, during COVID-19 pandemic, when some parts of the country were in lockdowns. The population grew by 2 million or 8.6% in five years. People identifying with a religious group declined by 3.1 percent. those identifying with a Christian denomination declined by 8.6 per cent, while the number identifying with a non-Christian religion increased by 32.2percent.

While migration has increased the number of people of non-Christian religions, all of the churches (the Uniting Church benefited by 6,000) have benefited from migration, and would have declined further without migration.

The Baptists and Seventh-day Adventists grew by 1 percent. Eastern Orthodox grew by 7 percent and Oriental Orthodox grew by 19 percent. All other churches declined. The biggest decline was in the Salvation Army (-28), then Uniting (-23), Presbyterian (-21), Anglicans (-20), and Lutherans (-16). The Pentecostals declined by 2 percent.

These findings affirm what many suspected, but it is not all hard news. While Church attendances across the board are down, around 44 percent of the population continue to identify as Christian. Around three to four percent of Australians have turned to religion as adults, often to turn their lives around. Philip Hughes ("Understanding the 2021 Census Figures." *Pointers* Volume 32 No 3, September 2022) makes an important point that about 25 per cent of the population who do not wish to identify with a religious denomination, continue to describe themselves in other surveys as 'spiritual' and therefore open to exploring issues of faith.

The early church began with a few disciples. But it is not the size that counts. In John's gospel (Chapter 20), on Easter Day, Jesus appeared to the disciples and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said, "as the Father sent me, so I send you. Receive the Holy Spirit." Jesus breathed the Holy Spirit upon the disciples, just as the Spirit of God breathed on creation at the first (Genesis 3). Then Jesus said, "If you

forgive the sins of any they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." The fledgling church was set on its way.

We do live in tumultuous times and our confidence is surely tested. However, the church is sent by none other than the living God. The church is sent not to work in its own strength; it is to draw upon the life-giving energy of the Holy Spirit. We are to be faithful to God who calls to us with the greeting of peace; who breathes upon us the same Spirit of God as on the early disciples, and at creation; who sends us, just as the Father sent Jesus.
