REFLECTION

We are in the season of Lent. Lent is 40 days, not including Sundays. Every Sunday is a celebration of the resurrection of Jesus, a little Easter, if you like. The forty days coincides with the forty days of the flood in the time of Noah, the forty years the Israelites were in the wilderness following the Exodus from captivity in Egypt and before entering the Promised Land, and the forty days of Jesus in the wilderness being tested.

Lent is a time to reassess our relationship with Jesus Christ. Our reassessment is part of our preparations to enter into the Christian pilgrimage of Holy Week with Palm/Passion Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and the Great Three Days of Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Day. Like Bathurst Uniting Church this year, many Churches will often include Holy Week morning prayers; our will be on zoom.

Today many churches assist their people prepare by conducting Lenten Bible Studies, often on the theme of Easter. Our church is no different. It is not too late to join a Lenten Study group for this year.

Looking to Easter. Historically baptisms were conducted on Easter day. Also, people who had strayed from the faith and were returning were reincorporated. Usually, congregations also reaffirm their baptism on Easter Sunday.

In the very early church baptism confirmation was one action, but the confirmation part was conducted by the Bishop. As the church expanded, Bishops could not be at every baptism, so the practice arose of baptism which was later confirmed by the Bishop when they were able to visit that church.

At 6pm (during daylight savings period) – contemporary, informal, all ages worship in the Activities Hall.

Please note: Daylight savings ends on 2 April so worship will be at 5pm.

Over time the baptism and confirmation became separated by years. Many churches baptised infants and when the person was of an age they reaffirmed their baptism in a confirmation service. In the Catholic and Anglican churches the Bishop still conducts the confirmation. In churches such as the Uniting, Presbyterian, Methodist and some others, confirmation is usually conducted by a minister of the word or deacon, though where there is no minister, it might be conducted by a Church Council authorised person, and maybe someone who is authorised by the Presbytery to conduct the sacraments.

Confirmation is reaffirming Baptism. That is, it is usual that people who were baptised as infants, now teenagers or adults, have reaffirmed the baptism and the vows that were made on their behalf. Confirmation includes a blessing.

On Easter Sunday in Bathurst in our morning service may well include a baptism, a confirmation, and the entire congregation will reaffirm their baptism. We will also have communion.

COMMUNITY CARE CALLS

Seymour Centre has asked us to share this information with you.

The Commonwealth Home Support Program (CHSP) auspiced by Bathurst Seymour Centre, provides low-level assistance to remain at home. The CHSP is for senior Australians who need support to live independently at home and are either: υ aged 65 years or over (50 or over for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander peoples) and have sensory impairments, functional limitations and need assistance υ prematurely aged (50 years or older; 45 years or older for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples) and are on a low income, homeless, or at risk of being homeless as a result of housing stress or not having secure accommodation. The Social Support — Individual program, called Community Care Calls is assistance provided by a qualified Support Worker. Bathurst Seymour Centre offers regular phone calls to eligible clients who are socially isolated, at risk of being socially isolated or live in a geographically isolated area.

How to register My Aged Care is the entry point to the aged care system for older people, their families and carers and is responsible for conducting assessments for the CHSP. The first step to access government funded aged care services is to call 1800 200 422 or visit their website, which we can always help you with. www.myagedcare.gov.au Depending on the demand for the service you may need to be placed on a waiting list if we are at capacity.
