Reflection

On March 3, at the 9:30 am service there will be a renewing of the covenant, and the recommissioning of re-elected leaders Lillian Beauchamp and Judy Tyson as Church Councillors, and commissioning of newly elected leader David McLeod as a Church Councillor.

The covenant service has a long history. The covenant was a feature of the antecedent churches of the uniting Church, Congregationalist, Presbyterian and Methodist. John Wesley, who founded the Methodist church in the eighteenth century, encouraged the renewal of the covenant on New Years Eve. In our era, it seems to work best conducted on a Sunday that marks the commencement of church activities for the year. It so happens that this year the Lectionary readings (a set of Bible readings agreed to by the churches across the world) for the Service on March 3 includes the giving of the ten commandments, which is a type of covenant. This follows on from the previous Sundays (25 February) Old Testament reading from Genesis of God making a covenant to Abram and Sari, and the week before (18 February) of God making a covenant in the time of Noah with creation with the sign of the rainbow.

Covenants are initiated by God. They are a gift, which when we receive it there are obligations. It could be considered as similar to a legal contract.

The response by the people in the covenant service is nothing less than a whole-hearted total commitment. The words of the response are below. You might like to ponder these words and their implications during the rest of the pilgrimage to Easter.

I am no longer my own, but yours.

Put me to what you will, rank me with whom you will;
put me to doing, put me to suffering;
let me be employed for you or laid aside for you;
exalted for you or brought low for you;
let me be full, let me be empty;
let me have all things, let me have nothing;
I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things to your pleasure and disposal.
And now, glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit,
you are mine and I am yours, to the glory and praise of your name. Amen.

The William Davidson organ of Bathurst UC turns 150 on Wednesday 13 March. Celebrations will commence with an organ masterclass on Saturday 9 March and continue through 2024.



Sunday, March 10, 2024

9:30 am: Sunday morning celebration service. The organist will be Internationally renowned organist Christopher Wrench. Dr Kelvi Hastie will speak about organs and about the Bathurst UC William Davidson organ. There will be acknowledgement of Judy Brooke's 62 years as organist, and recognition that Judy has been a faithful custodian of the organ over those years, ensuring it has been regularly tuned and serviced. Special anniversary cake will be cut during morning tea.

2:30 pm: Special Anniversary concert. Bathurst UC & Allegri Singers present *All Stops Out Concert*, featuring

internationally renowned organist Christopher Wrench, Allegri sings and the Orange Chamber Choir. Tickets: \$40. Concession: \$35. Commemorative program \$5. Proceeds of the concert will go to both Allegri Singers and to the Bathurst UC organ Fund, to provide for maintenance and funds to restore the organ in 30 plus years' time.

Wednesday, March 13, 2024

5: 00 pm: Special celebration Wednesday 13 March, 5 pm. Unveiling of the organ video featuring Judy Brooke showcasing the organ. On the night Judy will also play a range of pieces that show the capacity of the organ. A plaque will also be unveiled marking the occasion. There will be a cake to cut and light refreshments.
